

POTTER-SMITH

Rhode Island marriage records show the marriage of John Smith and Elizabeth Potter, at Newport, who evidently were the parents of John Potter Smith, though we haven't this definitely. The Potter family originated in America with Robert Potter (1610-55) who came to Lynn in 1630 and moved to Newport in 1638.

MORRARTY-DENNISON

- William Dennison, born 1586, came to Roxbury in 1631, died November 26, 1655, married Elizabeth Margaret, and had sons Daniel, Edward and George.
- George Denison, born in England 1618, married (1) Bridget Thompson, returned to England and fought as a Captain under Cromwell, was wounded at Naseby and nursed by Ann, dau. of John Borodel, returning with her after marriage to her to Roxbury, thence to Stonington. He was a magistrate of New London. Had children by Ann Borodel (called Lady Ann but thought not to be noble family): John, Ann, Borodel, George, William, Margaret and Mercy.
- John Denison, (Captain), born July 14, 1646. Married Phebe, dau. of Robert and Sarah Lay, and died 1689. Had children: John, George, Robert, William, Daniel, Samuel, Ann, Phebe and Sarah.
- Robert Denison (Captain), born September 6, 1673, and married Joanna (Gardner) Stanton, dau. of Robert and Joanna Stanton of New London, and had:
Ann, John, Joanna, Mary, Robert, Nathaniel, Andrew, Sarah, Ann, Thomas, Lucy, Elizabeth, Abigail and George.
- Colonel Robert Denison, born 1697. Captain in General Roger Wolcott's brigade (See Wolcott). Present at capture of Louisburg and cited for bravery. Promoted to Colonel and married (1) Deborah, dau. of Matthew and Phoebe Griswold of Lyme (See Griswold) who died in 1732. Had by her Deborah, Robert, Elizabeth, Daniel, Andrew, Mary and second Robert. Married (2) Prudence Sherman, dau. of David and Mercy Sherman of New Haven. Married ~~shortly before he removed to Horton, Nova Scotia (1776)~~ ¹⁷³⁴ *To Horton* ¹⁷⁶⁶. Had by her: David Sherman, Mercy, third Robert, Gurdon, Samuel, Sarah and Eunice.
- Andrew Denison, born Connecticut 1728. Married in 1749 Mary Thompson, who died in 1803, and had the following children: Robert, Christopher, Isaac, John, Mary, Elisha, Mercy, Ann and Joseph.
- Mary Denison, married John Morrarty, brother of Edmond.
- Ann Denison, married Edmond Augustus Morrarty. Note the similarity of children's names (of Edmond) to individuals in the foregoing paragraphs.

The reason for changing the name of Morrarty was not the French Revolution as previously mentioned, but was the exile of the French Canadians from Arcadia. Horton was the township in which was located Grand Pre, made famous by Longfellow's Evangeline, and in Horton there was one Jean Nuiratte, who signed the oath of allegiance to George II in 1730, but refused to sign the oath of 1755 which called for military service under England. It was doubtless at this time that the name was changed, from Nuiratte to Moratty, and, later, to Morrarty. The first change may have been to Morratty. There is some evidence that John (husband of Mary) bore the name Moirarty, a little closer to Nuiratte, but at least Edmond writes his name as Morratty.

Robert II married Euphemia, daughter of Sir Hugh de Ross, Earl of Ross, who himself married Lady Maud Bruce, sister of King Robert the Bruce. His sister married Edward, brother of Bruce. Hugh had Hugh of Rariches, 1st of Balnagown, who had William of Rariches, Second of Balnagown, who had Walter, Third of Balnagown, who had Hugh, Fourth of Balnagown, who had (1) John, Fifth of Balnagown and (2) Hugh, First of Balmachy. From these two sons are descended the American Rosses one of whom married a Leach and was the mother of Ann Leach, wife of John Potter Smith.

This family begins with Skeagh Macduff, second son of Constantine, Third Earl of Fife. Skeagh obtained Inverness Castle from Malcom IV in 1163.

219 Their Captaincy of Clan Chattan begins with Angus, in 1291, who succeeded to the Chieftainship by reason of his marriage with a daughter of Gilpatrick, Chief of Clan Chattan.

Angus, brother of Lachlan, died 1595, before his brother.

His son, Sir Lachlan Mackintosh, was 17th Chief of

Clan Chattan. He married August 16, 1611, Agnes

Grant (b. 1594) who later married Lachlan of Borlum, her husband's cousin.

John of Dalziel, brother of Lachlan, married Christine Mackay in 1589.

Malcom, brother of Lachlan, married Janet McDonald, dau. of Alister McAngus McDonald.

Isobel, married December 16, 1605, Sir Robert Campbell.

WILLIAM of Essick and Borlum, second son of William, 15th

Captain, married daughter of Robert Innes (d. 1627)

Lachlan, Second of Borlum, son of William, who married Elizabeth, daughter of Grant, his cousin's widow.

William of Borlum, married (1656) Mary Baillie, son of Baillie of Dunain.

(Authority for the above is the Scots Peerage of Burke and others.)

{ Brigadier General William Mackintosh, called "Old Borlum," uncle and guardian of John Mor McIntosh.

Lachlan of Knocknagail, second son of William and Mary Baillie and father of John Mor McIntosh.

Married Mary Lockhart, son of John of Inverness, a descendant of the Lockhart who carried Bruce's heart to the Holy Land.

John Mor McIntosh, married Marjory Stuart Fraser, dau. of Fraser of Garthmore.

Lachlan McIntosh, (spelled by his father Lacklan) (one of the twelve children of John Mor McIntosh) who married Sarah Threadcraft.

Fannie Maria McIntosh (b. about 1785) married (1) Captain Benjamin Griswold, and (2) Daniel Miner.

Mary Marie Griswold, married John M. Morrarty, Sr.

John M. Morrarty, Jr., married Rebecca Ann Smith, descendant of the Rosses.

Casalena Ellsworth Morarty, married Adrian VanderPyl.

Notes: In 1689 the Mackintoshes held charters from Donald Lord of the Isles, to Keppoch, Glenspean, Glenroy and the Braes of Lochaber.

The Lairdship of Borlum was passed from Brigadier William to his son Shaw, thence to Shaw's son Edward, who was outlawed and fled to France. Some say that he came to America and held high rank under Washington but apparently they are confusing him with Lachlan. There is no evidence that John Mor McIntosh ever held the Lairdship of Borlum as claimed by his biographer. For the offense for which Edward was outlawed his brother Alexander was executed, but it was subsequently found that he was not guilty of the offense, though Edward may have been. Borlum, which had been reduced to the estate at Raitts with Edward, passed out of the hands of the McIntosh family with his flight.

John Mor McIntosh was the first to protest (to the Board of Trustees of the Colonies, in England) against the introduction of slaves into the Colonies, particularly Georgia.

Roderick (Rory), grandfather of Colonel Mackintosh, the Creek Chieftain, was a brother of John Mor McIntosh.
